Recommended Junior into Senior Year Timeline

WINTER

- Register for SATs/ACTs
- Attend college information sessions
- Research colleges
- Begin building college list
- Select challenging classes for Senior Year
- Register with NCAA
 Clearinghouse
 (Student-Athletes)

SPRING

- Visit college campuses
- Attend college fairs
- Take SATs/ACTs
- Request teacher letters of recommendation
- Begin college essay
- Research scholarships & financial aid

SUMMER

- Continue to visit college campuses
- Create Common
 Application account
- Continue drafting college essay
- Update college list in Naviance
- Review admissions requirements and deadlines

- FALL
- Retake SAT for higher score if necessary
- Complete Common Application
- Finalize College Essay
- Attend ShawsheenTech College &Career Fair
- Attend Financial Aid Night
- Submit College Applications

Types of Admission Deadlines

Early Action

- DeadlinesOctober/November
- Decision notification
 December/January

Early Decision

- Same deadline & decision notification as EA
- Can only apply to one Early Decision college
- Decision is binding

Regular Decision

- Deadlines anywhere from January to April
- Decision notification anywhere between
 2-12 weeks

Rolling Admissions

- Application reviewed as soon as all materials received
- Decision notification is usually 2-3 weeks

Community Colleges

- Earn an Associate Degree or Certificate
- Open Admission
 - Any student with a high school diploma or GED/HiSet will be accepted
 - No GPA requirements or SATs (Some majors [Dental/Nursing] require prerequisites)
 - Quick application process



Massachusetts Free Community College

- ► Requirements
 - ► Must complete FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
 - ► Resident in MA for at least 1-year
 - ▶ Must continue to live in MA until degree/program completion
 - ▶ Tuition & fees covered
 - Textbooks not covered
 - ► Must be enrolled in minimum of 6 credits per semester in a degree or certificate program

Massachusetts Free Community College Requirements for Non-US Citizens

- ► Attend a MA high school for at least 3 years
- ► Earn a diploma in MA
- ► Complete a MAFSA (Massachusetts Application for State Aid)
- ▶ Provide one of the following documents
 - ► Valid Social Security number
 - ► Taxpayer ID number
 - ▶ Proof of registration for Selective Service

MASS TRANSFER/ Commonwealth Commitment

Begin at one of the MA community colleges and complete an Associate Degree within 2.5 years.

Transfer to one of Massachusetts' State Universities or UMass campuses

Guaranteed admission to MA State University with a 2.5 GPA


Guaranteed transfer of credits into Bachelor Program

Additional discounts for students who maintain 3.0 GPA

4-Year College/University Admission Requirements

- **►** Transcript
 - ► Strength of classes (quality/rigor)
 - ► Academic performance/grades and GPA
- ► Essay(s)
- **▶** Letters of recommendation
- **►** Extracurricular activities
- ► SAT/ACT scores (if required)

*Highly Selective Private Colleges (BU, Northeastern, Harvard) will have more rigorous requirements such as supplemental essays, interviews, 4+ years of all core academic subjects

MA State University World Language Requirement Exception for CTE Students

- ► Complete an additional academic elective and (1) of the following options:
 - ► Complete one World Language course (such as Spanish 1)
 - ► Complete an additional course in Science, Technology, or Engineering
 - **▶** Does not need to be a laboratory course
 - **▶** Complete one Computer Science course



MA State University Minimum GPA Requirements

- ▶3.0 GPA required for both the state universities and the UMass campuses
 - ► Recalculated and weighted for Honors & Concurrent Enrollment courses
 - ► Courses not noted as CP/Honors/CE do not count
- ►GPA/SAT Score sliding scale can be used for students who do not meet the 3.0 GPA requirement

Common Application

- ► Largest college application platform
- ► More than 1,000 schools participate use Common App to apply to multiple schools
- ► Site is free to use individual schools typically charge an application fee
- ► Schools also may use their own college application that applies only to their institution
 - ► Many colleges who offer their own application will also accept the Common App

Financial Aid Overview

- ► The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - ► Determines eligibility for federal financial aid
- CSS Profile
 - ► Required by some schools
 - ► Determine eligibility for non-federal financial aid
- Scholarships
 - ► Merit (Academic) Institutional
 - ▶ Local
 - National
 - Athletic
 - ► Student Specific





Net Price Calculator

- ▶ The Net Price Calculator gives estimate of potential college costs
 - "Net price" is the amount of money students and parents pay for college out-of-pocket and/or through student loans
 - Net price=
 - ▶ total cost of attendance (tuition, room & board, and books)
 - Minus any grants and scholarships
 - ▶ Can be found on the college website in the financial aid section
 - Uses information such as parent income, taxes, assets along with student GPA, class rank, and standardized test scores
 - Some college's Net Price Calculators are more accurate than others and may not include potential merit-based aid in the calculation

Military and Service Academies



- ASVAB test offered at Shawsheen Tech for juniors and seniors on May 21st
- Military recruiters visit ST once per month outside of the cafeteria
- Service Academies:
 - * Army (West Point)
 - * Air Force (Colorado)
 - * Navy (Annapolis)
 - * U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (New York)
 - Coast Guard (Connecticut)
 - Entrance is very competitive All have a component of required military service.
 - Programs with * require congressional appointments

Student Licensure Hours received at Shawsheen

- Students receive hours towards state licensure in the following shops
 - **▶** Plumbing
 - ► HVAC
 - Cosmetology
 - ► Electrical



Examples of Licensure Requirements

Massachusetts Journeyman Electrical Examination readiness

- ► Work Experience 8,000 clock hours under a master electrician
 - ► A co-op student can obtain up to 2,000 hours here at Shawsheen
- ► **Education Theory** 600 clock hours of classroom instruction
 - ▶ Shawsheen students can earn up to 300 of the required 600 hours at ST

Massachusetts Journeyman Plumbing Examination readiness

- ► Work Experience 6,800 clock hours under a master plumber
 - ► A co-op student can obtain 1,700 hours here at Shawsheen
- ► **Education Theory** 550 clock hours of classroom instruction
 - ▶ Shawsheen students can earn up to 330 clock hours can be earned at ST towards tiers 1, 2, & 3

Licensure/Technical Programs and Career Training Options

- Shawsheen Tech Adult Education program
- Other Regional Vocational Schools Greater Lowell, Nashoba Tech
- Peterson School, Portsmouth Naval Yard, General Dynamics Bath Ironworks
- Community Colleges with vocational programs –Middlesex, Mass Bay, Northern Essex, North Shore, Bunker Hill, Southern Maine, Central Maine, etc.
- Unions-Pipefitters, Bricklayers, Laborers, Plumbers, Electrical, Ironworkers, etc.

Cooperative Education

- ▶ Opportunity for students to be employed in their fields of study while still in high school.
- ► Students may become eligible as early as their junior year.
- ► Placement is always in the student's vocational major to enhance and expand the student's understanding of the career field.
- ► Fourth-quarter eligibility is based on standards for the first three quarters of junior year
 - Attendance and Punctuality
 - Maximum of 6 total days absent
 - Maximum combined total of 9 days absents and tardy


